"Sign up for this. Please buy this. Can you add these dates to your calendar?"

Do you find yourself overwhelmed by requests for your contribution? This is a symptom of our "attention economy," where there are so many demands for our interest and time that it becomes a buzz or noise that we wish we could block out. The email subject line reads, "*Click now before this offer runs out.*" But they're not offering you something. They're selling you something.

In the face of this fatigued attention economy, we also face this question: "*What does God require of us?*" So often, it's difficult to answer this question because we struggle to quiet the noise and notice God's still, small voice. But when we slow down, we notice a gap and space in us. We want to help and serve, but how can we do this in a world that demands so much of us?

Author Frederick Buechner offers us a beautifully simple statement regarding where we are to spend our time as we follow this calling from God: **"The place God calls you to is the place where your deep gladness and the world's deep hunger meet."** God has designed you to know deep joy and gladness in sharing your gifts in the world. And the world, your community, your church – we celebrate when you bring those gifts in their fullness.

This month, we ask for your commitments for the upcoming year. First, we seek your pledge for financial support, which is essential in helping us form our annual budget. Second, though, is this incredibly important piece of asking for your help in the form of time and talents. We need your help! God has blessed you with particular gifts, and as we share life as a church community, we ask you to show up with those gifts and give them away — help others, serve, and share all the beautiful skills you have to offer to strengthen our community.

Of course, we must use our gifts to help the world and serve our neighbors.

You are already doing this through volunteering around Bellingham, giving your skills to many different organizations that are so blessed to receive them. We also ask you to sign up and get your hands dirty helping each other. So, this season, we ask you to please sign up to contribute your Time & Talents.

- Do you have administrative skills? We need your help around the church office.
- Are you a writer? We'd love your help with our church communications.
- Do you play music? We want to hear you share your gift in worship.
- Are you a zealous techie? We need sound, web, and visual support!

In a church community, we need the strengths and gifts of the many to tackle all the little things we do. Sometimes, the opportunities are simple, like giving time to help greet people on a Sunday morning and hand them a bulletin. In other scenarios, we need wise leaders who will help us discern God's leading for our congregation's future, folks who can serve as an Elder or Deacon.

This year, we want to hear how you WILL help out around St. James. We can admit that we aren't always great at asking for help, but this season, as we look forward to 2024, *we are asking for help.* YOUR help!

Additionally, as you consider your 2024 financial pledge, you may want to consider that part of how you can give back to God is with your time and talents. Maybe this isn't a season when you can give financially, or perhaps you are exhausted by the requests for money you get everywhere and, instead, want to DO something. That's wonderful because God is directing your deep joy towards the deep hunger and needs that extend far beyond what we offer of our financial resources.

- The Loving Welcome Committee reported a good response to the recent "date night" program.
- The Personnel Committee is beginning to work on the pastor's Terms of Call and staff salaries for the 2024 budget.
- The Session was reminded of the Northwest Coast Presbytery meeting at St. James on October 26th. The Session is encouraged to attend the events on that day.
